Year 1 Topics

Autumn

Our topic for the Autumn Term is Amazing Animals!

Spring

Our topic for the Spring Term is called Far, Far Away!

Summer

Our topic for the Summer Term is 'To Infinity... and Beyond!'

These are cross-curricular themes that will run throughout our subjects, including: Literacy, Science, Geography, Art and Design & Technology.

Towards the end of each term, we will also be covering a variety of seasonal topics, such as Christmas, Easter and Harvest.

Homework

Reading

Pupils are given 5 books per week, check class information sheets for details. Parents welcomed to discuss with teachers levels of books. 5 books are given on Wednesday each week.

Reading record books should be signed by parents.

Spellings

Group 1 15 spellings

Group 2 20 spellings

Group 3
25 spellings

Consists of sound group and sight words. Tests set on Fridays with books sent home for parents to review.

Maths

Pupils given a maths sheet per week to be completed in pencil.

Optional mental activities, such as practising number bonds and times tables.

Homework is set on a Friday, to be returned on the following Thursday.

The work will consist of a spelling list for your child to practise, and a Maths activity which will reinforce learning that has taken place in school.

Handwriting Lowercase

Handwriting Uppercase

- •Recognise letter sound and letter name with lowercase form.
- •Form capital letters correctly
- •Form capital letters placed correctly on the line and correct size.

Spelling

- •Spell simple words with single sounds e.g. cat.
- •Spell simple words beginning with a blend e.g. stop.
- •Spell simple words with vowel phonemes e.g. look, feet.
- •Spell simple words ending with harder blends e.g. gold, send.
- •Spell sight words from the Reception list.
- •Spell sight words from Year 1 / 2 list.
- •Spell sight words from Year 4 / 5 list.

Writing

- •Write a short simple sentence.
- •Write a simple sentence with a capital letter and full stop.
- •Write a few slightly longer sentences with simple punctuation.
- ·Write sentences using question and exclamation marks.



Children in 1C and 1H have P.E. on WEDNESDAY and FRIDAY.



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Behaviour




Tokens

Tokens are given for good behaviour, manners and general conduct both in class and around the school. Every week the tokens are counted and the amount announced in assembly, the class with the highest number of tokens get a reward of their choice e.g. extra playtime, golden time or computer time.

Rewards and House Points

When a pupil has tried hard in their work they are given a super star on their chart or a stamp on their work. After 5 stars they get 1 house point. At the end of each term the top 4 pupils in each class receive a certificate and at the end of each year the house with the most points wins the school trophy cup. Points are given for good work and/or good effort in an activity. Pupils can also earn extra house points for their conduct around the school.



E-Safety at Breaside
